WHO HAS RESPONSIBILITY FOR THAT?

Many of the calls that come into Essex Police, often on the 999 number, are not emergency calls. An emergency is a situation where there is serious risk of injury, risk of serious damage to property, or when a crime or suspicious incident is in progress.

Essex County Council delivers a wide range of services and understands that there may be times when you don't know who to direct your query to.

Together, we want to help you get to the person who can deal with your problem - first time. This leaflet will help you find out who is responsible for what and guide you on who to call in any number of situations.

ABANDONED VEHICLES

It is the responsibility of your local, district or borough councils to remove abandoned cars (see **COUNCILS** for contact numbers). They are obliged by the Refuse Disposal (Amenity) Act 1978 to remove the vehicle from any land in the open air or forming part of the highway. They must follow prescribed procedure in respect of the notice prior to removal. This would normally take the form of a sticker attached to the vehicle which has to stay on the vehicle for seven days. Council refuse departments have limited resources so it may take longer than this for the vehicle to be removed.

You can report an abandoned vehicle to the police but the following information is needed:

- Your name, address and telephone number.
- Vehicle registration, make/model and colour.
- Condition of vehicle.
- Was anyone seen leaving the vehicle?
- Is the vehicle taxed?
- Location of vehicle - with directions if necessary - and how long it has been there.

Some councils have special policies to deal with abandoned cars, ask your local council for details.

ANIMALS

Cruelty to Animals

If you are concerned about the general safety and well-being of animals please call the RSPCA (24 hours) Tel: 0300 1234 999.

If there is an immediate danger, for example dog locked in a car and in distress on a hot day, call 999 for an immediate response.

Dogs

- An accident involving a dog needs to be reported to the police.
- Dogs causing a nuisance (for example noise, fouling) need to be reported to your local dog warden (See opposite)
- Cruelty to dogs - see Cruelty to Animals
- Aggressive or dangerous dogs - call the police.
- Stray, lost or found dogs - contact your local dog warden.

Injured Animals

For animals injured in a road traffic accident call 999. For other injured animals, contact the RSPCA: (24 Hours) 0300 1234999 or a local veterinary surgeon.

Injured and Sick Marine Life

For any sick or injured marine life (especially seals, porpoises, dolphins and whales), the British Divers Marine Life Rescue (BDMLR) organisation can and will assist in their capture and treatment. Contact the BDMLR 24 hour helpline on 01825 765546. www.bdmlr.org

Straying Animals

If you see animals (for example horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs) found straying on or near a highway,



please call 999. There is an offence under Sec.155 Highways Act 1980 of letting animals near or on a highway and the keeper of the animals can be prosecuted. However the police would normally attempt to move the animals away from the road and trace the owner.

DATA PROTECTION

Under the current Data Protection Act 1998, members of the public are able to obtain a copy of the information held about them on the Police National Computer (PNC), subject to certain exemptions. You need to complete an Essex Police A96 Subject Access form and pay a £10 fee. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

If you have to report an accident or spillage involving dangerous substances, IMMEDIATELY dial 999 and call the Essex Fire and Rescue Service, who have specialist equipment to deal with the problem. DO NOT ATTEMPT A RESCUE. Wait for the fire service to arrive, and remain UPWIND of the incident. If you need advice regarding the storage, disposal or transportation of hazardous substances, please contact your local council or the Health and Safety Executive at Wren House, Hedgerows Business Park, Colchester Road, Springfield, Chelmsford CM2 5PF. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Neighbourhood Watch is a way for local people to get together to help prevent crime and make their community a safer place. Neighbourhood Watch schemes often begin with people sharing crime reduction advice, keeping any eye on each others' properties and learning to communicate effectively with the police.



The benefits of Neighbourhood Watch are an improved community spirit and a reduced fear of crime. Essex has a County Neighbourhood Watch Association, which co-ordinates the work across the county. Details of your local Neighbourhood Watch divisional co-ordinator can be obtained from your nearest police station or by visiting the web site at www.neighbourhoodwatch.net

NOISE

Complaints of excess noise are dealt with by the Environmental Health Service of the local council, not by the police, unless there is the possibility of public disorder or a criminal offence taking place. However, if you hear noises that suggest that someone is in danger, you should contact the police.

OBSCENE OR NUISANCE COMMUNICATIONS

If you are reporting this for the first time, ring BT Customer Service on 150 for advice or 0800 666 100 for recorded advice, or the appropriate network if you are not a BT customer.

PARKING

The enforcement of parking restrictions is undertaken by local, district and borough councils and Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs). CEOs will issue a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) to drivers who fail to comply with the parking restrictions. The charge of a PCN is £50 or £70 depending on the contravention, reduced by 50% if paid within 14 days. If this is not paid, the debt will be pursued through a civil court. If you want information on parking, you should contact your local council. Parking causing obstruction is still a matter for Essex Police where there are no waiting restrictions. For more details please contact your local councils on the numbers listed.

PASSPORTS

If your passport is lost or has been stolen, it is important that you report this to the UK Passport Service as soon as possible in order to help prevent future misuse of your document. To do this you

must submit a lost/stolen (LS01) report form. Call the UK Passport Service advice line on 0870 521 0410. Further information is available on www.ukpa.gov.uk/

PESTS

If you want advice or have a complaint about pests (for example rodents, wasps, bees, fleas), contact your local Environmental Health Department.

POLLUTION

If you need to report or complain about air pollution, contaminated land, contaminated sites or radiation, contact your local Environmental Health Department.

STREET LIGHTS

All faulty or damaged street lights in Essex should be reported to the Essex County Council Highways Office on 0845 603 7631.

SYRINGES AND NEEDLES

The police will not attend to remove any drugs paraphernalia (for example syringes, spoons, pipes, razor blades), under any circumstances. You will need to contact your local council who will safely clean up the offending articles.

TAXIS

If you have a complaint about a taxi driver (for example abusive conduct, over-charging) you need to contact your local council, as each authority has an officer who is responsible for the licensing of taxis and their drivers. If the complaint is about dangerous driving, you can either contact the council or contact your local police station.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS (Fixed and Temporary)

Fixed roadside traffic lights are the property and responsibility of Essex County Council Highways Department and any faults should be reported to them on 01245 357 345. Temporary traffic lights are the responsibility of the owner/contractor who is carrying out the road works. However, faults with these lights can be directed to the Essex County Council Highways department on 0845 603 7631.

TREES

A tree normally belongs to the land on which it is growing and the position of the trunk, where it emerges from the ground, determines ownership. If trees in your neighbour's garden overhang your property, you are entitled to cut off the overhanging branches. Any fruit or timber from the branches belong to your neighbour and should be returned to them. You are also entitled to trim back roots to the boundary, although you should always get professional advice before doing this as you could make the tree unstable. Before cutting any part of a tree, you should check with the arboreal staff at your local council whether it is covered by a Tree Preservation Order, which might prevent you doing this. If there is a chance of the tree encroaching on or causing damage to your property, you should speak to the owner of the tree, your insurance company or a solicitor. It is the responsibility of homeowners to ensure that trees overhanging the highway are not a hazard to road users. Anyone who wants to report a dangerous obstruction can contact 0845 603 7631.

UTILITIES (Gas, Water, Electricity)

Emergencies

If you are reporting damage to the gas, water or electricity systems which is likely to cause danger to people, please call the Essex County Fire and Rescue Service or the police on 999. If you smell gas, call Transco on 0800 111 999. For water emergencies, call Anglian Water on 08457 145145.

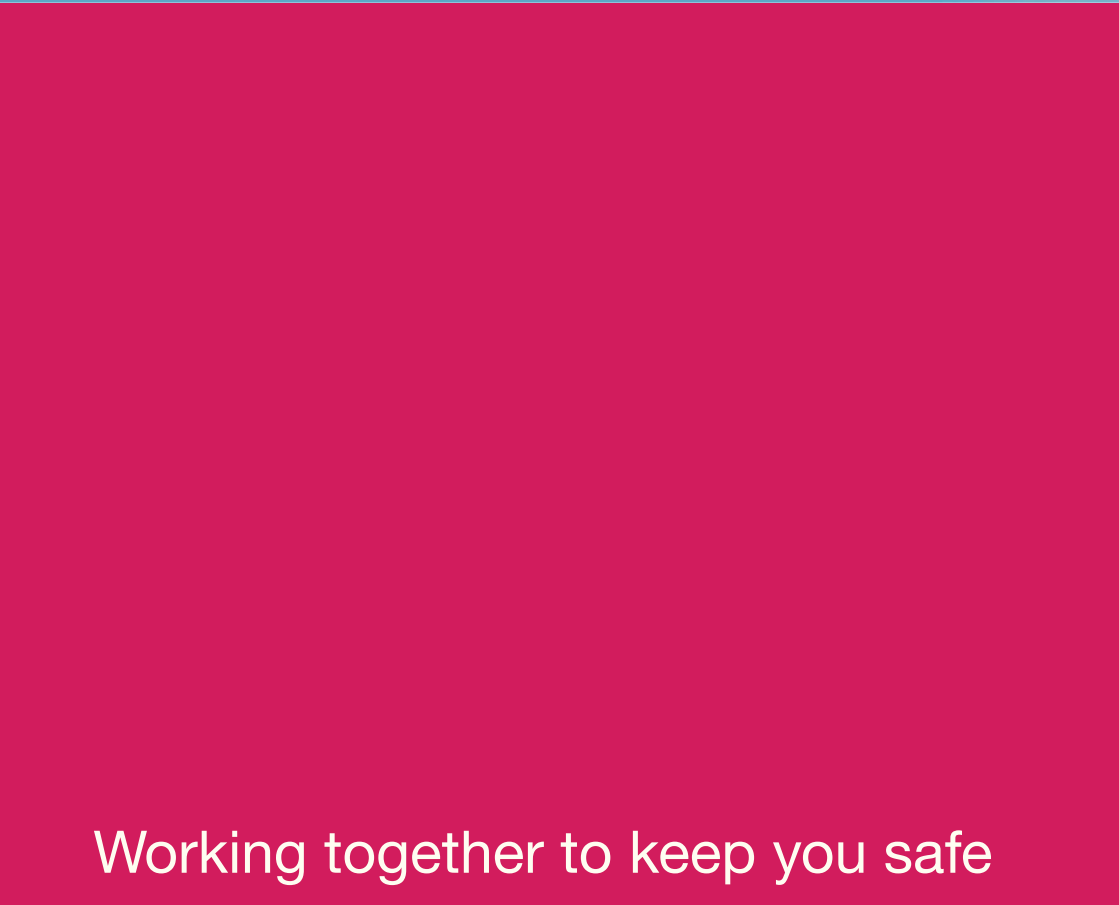
