SOCIAL MEDIA

MARKS AND SPENCER ARRIVED

Our local garage was refurbished and a new Marks and Spencer convenience store opened. Whilst we heard some complaints which the Parish Council have had to deal with but in the main many residents are praising its arrival.

CHRISTMAS TREE & CAROL SINGING

Again Calcott Farm allowed us to select a tree for our annual celebration of Christmas, though sadly their stock is running low. Many residents turned out for the lighting up event and enjoyed the sing-along carols, wine and mince pies. It would be great if more councillors came along to this year's event to help with the catering and setting up of the gazebo etc. So helping hands will be very welcome.

PROJECTS IN 2017/18

Two defibrillators were installed in the villages, on St Nicholas and St Andrews halls – thanks to a grant from National Lottery small awards scheme. A third defibrillator will be installed on a site to be confirmed later this year.

We held our first defibrillator training course in April which proved successful and popular. It was encouraging to see how many locals wanted to know about using the life saving devices. It is hoped to repeat this events later in the year.

SPEEDWATCH

We have the gun, we have the means. What we need is people power. Because we are short of helpers – once having 9 now only 3 - we have not been able to go out at all this year and only part of last year. We would like to promote this more so those interested please contact either the Parish Clerk or Chairman. Let's try to keep this going for the sake of safety.

GENERAL MAINTENANCE

The Parish Council have continued to maintain Peartrees Pond and grass verges at Button Common. We have encountered no problems this year.

PLANNING PRESSURES

We are aware of the forthcoming Local Development Plan. Although there are currently no plans for housing to be built within either village, the impact on infrastructure – schooling, doctors' traffic etc. – will undoubtedly have a big impact.

We will continue to liaise with Brentwood Borough Council and update residents in a timely manner.

The Parish Council will endeavour to work in the interest of all the residents of Herongate & Ingrave.

It will keep close ties with Essex Police, Brentwood Borough Council and Essex County Council.
